1 **1 Edits**

2 Edits refer to 02-007. Page and line numbers are displayed in the margin. Absent other  
3 instructions, a page and line number or line number range implies all of the indicated text is to  
4 be replaced by associated text, while a page and line number followed by + (-) indicates that  
5 associated text is to be inserted after (before) the indicated line. Remarks are noted in the  
6 margin, or appear between [ and ] in the text.

7 [In case we decide to add or delete an annex, we might forget to change this. So that we don't xii, last line  
8 need to worry, editor: "Annexes A to F" => "The annexes".]

9 All of the remaining edits are for page xiii. Since line numbers don't work in the introduction,  
10 we refer here to item numbers in the list, and line numbers within the items.

11 The primary problem attacked here is that the descriptions have differing expositional style.  
12 Some say "allowing", some say "where", some say "may" and some say "can". It leads one to  
13 wonder if there is something different about the issues for which we use different expositional  
14 style.

16 [Editor: "where" => "allows"; insert "to" before "have".] (1),3

17 [Editor: "where" => "allows"; "may" => "to".] (2),1

18 [Editor: "where" => "allows"; "may" => "to".] (2),2

19 [Editor: Delete "which".] (2),3

20 [Editor: "which" => "the".] (2),4

21 [Editor: "where" => "allows"; "can" => "to".] (5),1

22 [Editor: "which facilitates" => "allows".] (5),2

23 [Editor: Delete "which"; "for" => "to"; "specified" => "specific" - but if 02-107 passes, it takes (6),1  
24 precedence over these changes.]

25 [Editor: "allowing" => "allows".] (9),1

26 [Editor: "allowing" => "allows".] (9),2

27 [Editor: "which ... process" => "improves the ability to handle".] (11),2-3
