## 1 Introduction

In the sections in chapter 9 concerned with OPEN, CLOSE, WAIT and file positioning, the subsections describing specifiers all have titles like "The STATUS= specifier in the CLOSE statement" In 9.5.1 (data transfer statements), the style is different.
