## 1 Introduction

The rules for syntax terms rename and only-rename are identical. There are no constraints on either of them. There is only one use of only-rename in a syntax rule, and only one use of only-rename in the text – preceded by "rename or"! This paper proposes to replace usages of only-rename by rename and delete the rule for only-rename.

## 2 Edits
