### 10 2.2.3.4 Interface bodies and interface blocks

11 An **interface body** describes a procedure interface. The name of an interface body may be  
12 used to specify the interface of a dummy procedure, external procedure, procedure pointer, or  
13 type-bound procedure.

14 An **interface block** is either a specific interface block or a generic interface block. A specific  
15 interface block is simply a collection of interface bodies. A generic interface block may also be  
16 used
