### 1 Discussion

The restriction added in the edit to subclause 9.7 of F95 in Corrigendum 2 doesn't have a

- home in F2K. As of 99-007, there was a subclause 9.9 where it could have gone. It disappeared

#### 9.9 Restrictions on function references and list items

A function reference shall not appear in an expression anywhere in an input/output statement if such a reference causes another input/output statement that references an external unit to be executed.

Restrictions in the evaluation of expressions (7.1.8) prohibit certain side effects.

The restriction added in Corrigendum 2 was to insert "or a STOP statement" after "statement", but that doesn't work because "that references an external unit" was added some time between 97-007r2 and 99-007 (I haven't bothered tracking down when). So the "or a STOP statement"

addition after "statement" would have to be a "a STOP statement or" addition after "causes".

Do we want to replace this subclause? Edits below do this, along with the "a STOP statement or" addition. Some commas were added, and "another" was shortened to "an", to try to make it clear that "or another input/output statement" or "references an external unit" is not somehow

trying to modify "STOP statement". Also the title is a little bit weird, given that the restriction

20 is against "anywhere in an input/output statement," not "anywhere within an input/output

21 list," so it's changed to "Restrictions on function references in input/output statements."
