1 Background

See 86:15-21. This is in the section on procedure declaration statements.

Constraint: If a *proc-entity* has an accessibility attribute, an INTENT attribute, or a SAVE attribute, it shall also have the POINTER attribute.

Unresolved issue 15 (86:18-21)

There was a suggestion for a note explaining the above constraint.... Suggestion that accessibility should not be prohibited.

There appears to be no reason to require the POINTER attribute if an accessibility attribute is specified. A note explaining the other two restrictions is provided.

2 Edits
