1 Introduction

The sentence "The **ALLOCATABLE attribute** may be specified for an object" at 82:24 has almost no information content. The paragraph also mistakenly has "shape" where it should have "bounds."

2 Edits

Edits refer to 99-007r2. Page and line numbers are displayed in the margin. Absent other instructions, a page and line number or line number range implies all of the indicated text is to be replaced by immediately following text, while a page and line number followed by + indicates that immediately following text is to be inserted after the indicated line. Remarks for the editor are noted in the margin, or appear between [and] in the text.

The **ALLOCATABLE attribute** specifies that space for an object is allocated by an ALLOCATE statement (6.4.1). If the ALLOCATABLE attribute is specified for an array it shall be a deferred-shape array; the bounds, and hence the shape, are determined when space is allocated for the array.
